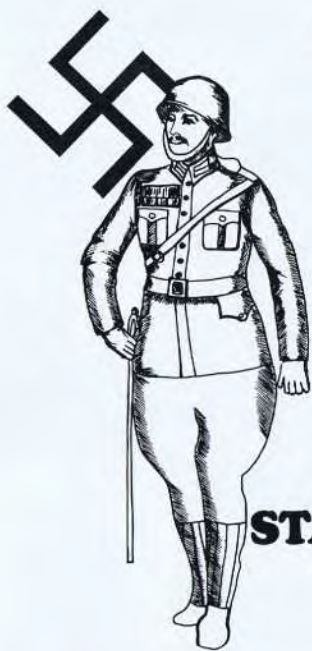


Newsday Marching Band Festival At Hofstra University

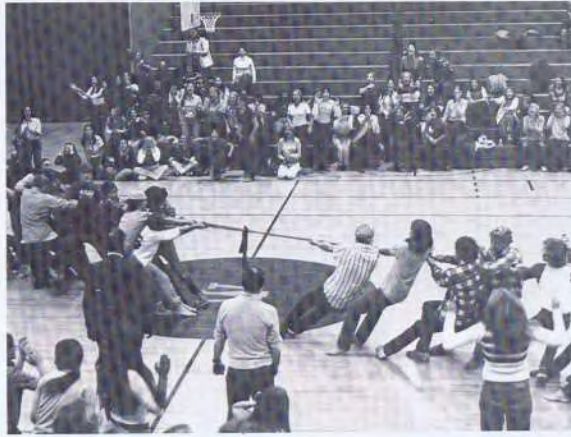

Play Production Class Presents 'Cabaret'



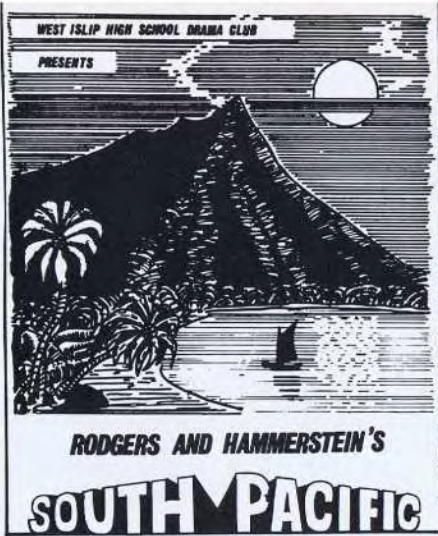

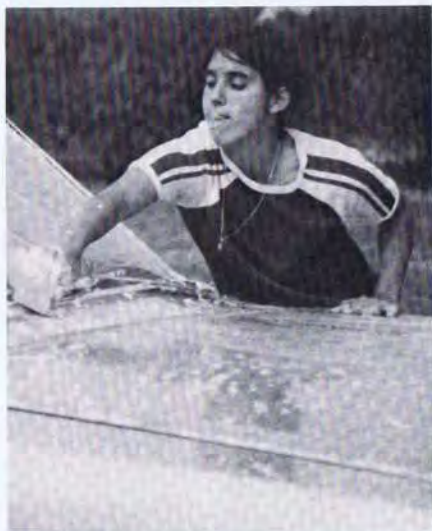
One of the many activities of the Junior Class was washing cars. The Class held two car washes, one in October and one in May.

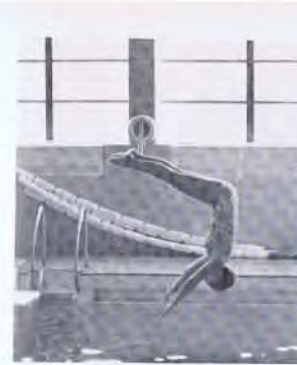

Hosting the league one Wrestling Tournament this year, Coaches Duart and Mellino are looking forward to a strong showing by their fine contingent of matmen.

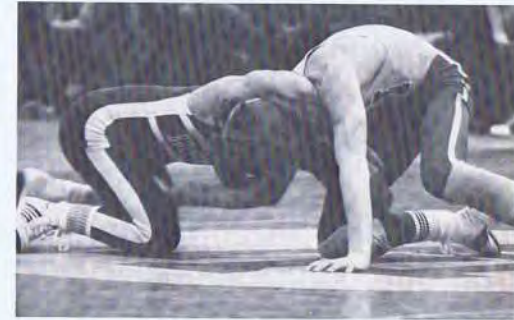

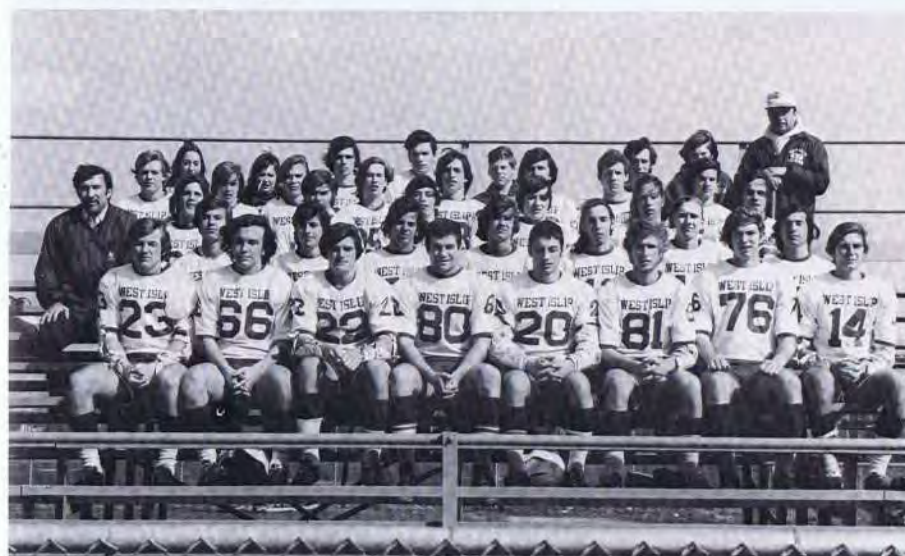

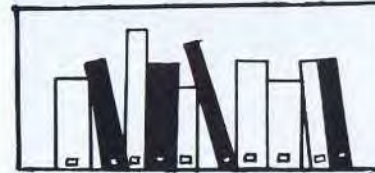
